

Intensive English Immersion Program for
Nagoya University
February/March 2019 (3 weeks or 4 weeks)

The Center for English as a Second Language (CESL) at Southern Illinois University Carbondale (SIUC) is happy to present a special Intensive English Program to students from Nagoya University. The program consists of 20 hours of English language instruction per week. Students will take a placement test upon arrival to determine the best level for their current language skills. They will also be integrated with students from all over the world that are participating in the regular CESL term. This is an excellent opportunity for Nagoya University students to strengthen their English skills while they also engage in extensive cultural exchange. In addition to classes, social activities and excursions will be provided to enhance the overall immersion experience.

Application procedure:

- 1- Students must complete the attached application. It is very short and easy to complete.
- 2- Send the application via email to the admissions officer, Lili Angel-Post, at: cesl@siu.edu
- 3- Attach the following documents to the email:
 - a. Good quality copy of your passport (must be valid for at least 1 year)
 - b. Proof of funding: This is a bank statement of the person paying for the program (self, parents, etc.). The amount of the bank statement must be equal or greater to the total cost of the program. The bank statement or letter must be in English.
- 4- After reviewing the documents, we will send the student an I-20 form, the document needed to apply for the F-1 student visa. We will send you instructions about the visa application procedure when we issue the I-20 form.

***TOTAL COST PER STUDENT:**

The total cost indicated above does not include meals.

- **Meals:** Students can purchase any number of “Block-20” meal plans. This meal plan includes 20 meals for \$190.00 at any of the on-campus residence halls. Many students chose this option in order to be able to eat lunch on campus, breakfast at their residence, and dinner out with friends. Another option is for the students to buy and prepare their own food in the large kitchen at Ambassador Hall. The kitchen is stocked by CESL with kitchen supplies (pots, pans, etc.) The approximate cost to buy groceries is about the same as for the Block-20 arrangement.

**** NOTES ABOUT HEALTH-RELATED COSTS:**

It is assumed here that the tuberculosis screening fee will be the \$10 charged for Japanese nationals. Students from countries on the “high risk for tuberculosis” list will be charged a \$40 fee.

*****NOTES on AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION:**

Pick up and drop off by CESL at STL is available only if there are 3 or more students in the group, both arrival and departure flights are scheduled for between 9:00 am and 9:00 pm, and all students are on the same flights. If arrival/departure is outside of these hours, student will need to stay in hotel near STL at their own expense. Students who are not transported from St. Louis to Carbondale by CESL (in cases of 1) only 1 or 2 students and/or 2) one or both flights are outside the hours stated above) may wish to consider use of:

******NOTES ON HOUSING:**

- **Double occupancy:** Students requesting the double occupancy option must indicate who within the group will be their roommate. Ambassador Hall cannot provide roommates. Students without a roommate must choose single occupancy.
- Both single and double occupancy rooms share 1 bathroom with the adjacent room.

Methods of payment:

- Students can pay before arrival using a foreign bank account or foreign credit card via the FlyWire website (no fees): <https://www.flywire.com/pay/ceslsiu>
- Students can also pay via bank transfer. Please make sure to add the transaction fee to the total amount. We can send the wire number, swift code, and other information needed for this method of payment.
- Students may also pay when they arrive using a credit or debit card. We recommend contacting your bank before you travel to let them know you will be using your card abroad and to raise your limit to at least the tuition amount.
